»» INCLUSION AWARENESS DAY ««

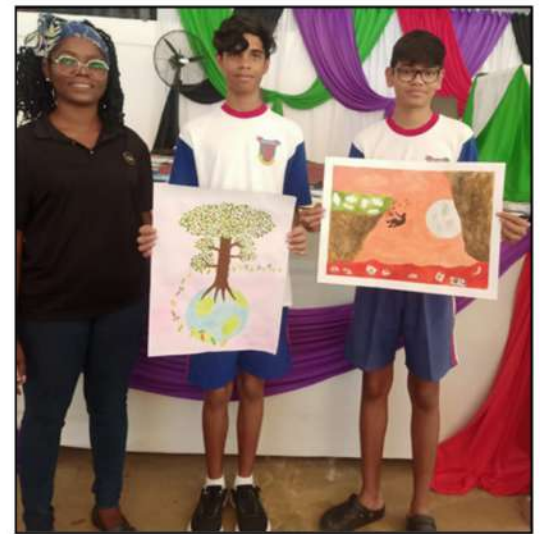


We proudly celebrated Inclusion Awareness Day, organized by our SEND Department in line with OAM's Mission.
