

»» DROP EVERYTHING AND READ ««





➤➤➤ YEAR 1 UNIT: A DAY IN THE LIFE

The Year 1 learners had an exciting start to their new unit, A Day in the Life, which explores different occupations. Their dreams and aspirations came to life as they dressed up to represent the professions they hope to pursue in the future. With great enthusiasm, they also enacted various roles, giving everyone a glimpse into what it's like to work in those jobs. It was a fun and inspiring day that sparked curiosity and imagination in every learner.



➤➤➤ YEAR 1 PROJECT BASED LEARNING

The year 1 learners were actively involved in crafting miniature workplace dioramas, showcasing a variety of professions such as farming, teaching, construction, and healthcare. Using readily available materials like cardboard, sticks, pompoms, clay, and coloured paper, the learners creatively construct detailed scenes that reflect real-world work environments. This hands-on learning experience encourages teamwork, enhances fine motor skills, and deepens their understanding of different careers and their roles in the community. The vibrant energy and imaginative designs highlight the children's enthusiasm and creativity.



➤➤➤ YEAR 2 THE MAGIC TOYMAKER

Our creative Year 2 learners kicked off their new unit with a burst of imagination and talent. Using nothing more than a sock and their creativity, they brought their very own puppets to life through a fun puppetry activity.

They also took part in a delightful Show and Tell session, where they proudly shared stories about their toys and identified the materials used in making their unique puppets. A magical start to a term of learning through play and exploration.



➤➤➤ YEAR 3 TEMPLES, TOMBS, TREASURES

Our Year 3 learners kicked off their Temples, Tombs, and Treasures entry point with an exciting hands-on project. Working in groups, they modeled ancient temples, tombs, and hidden treasures using clay soil — a wonderful opportunity to explore shapes, boost creativity, and build teamwork skills. Their imaginations soared as they added incredible ancient structures like the Egyptian pyramids and crafted treasures worthy of any explorer's dreams.



➤➤➤ YEAR 3 MAKING WAVES UNIT

This week, our curious Year 3 learners immersed themselves in the "Making Waves" unit, an exciting journey into the science of sound and light!

Exploring how light helps us see the world around us, students experimented with shadows, reflections, and sources of natural and artificial light. They also investigated how sound is produced, travels, and can be altered in pitch and volume.

In a joyful open-air performance, learners used their voices in harmony and added rhythm with tambourines, maracas and cabasa creating a beautiful soundscape that echoed what they'd learned in class.

This hands-on approach not only deepened their understanding of science concepts but also encouraged creativity, teamwork, and appreciation for music and the world of vibrations and waves around us.



➤➤➤ YEAR 4 VOLCANIC ERUPTION IN ACTION

To kick off their exciting unit, our Year 4 learners got hands-on by creating their very own erupting volcanoes. Each student built a model of an active volcano and experimented with different amounts of baking powder, vinegar, food colouring and soap to simulate a real volcanic eruption — with plenty of fizz, foam and fun!

As part of this explosive entry point, students also explored the states of matter by identifying the solids, liquids, and gases involved in their experiments. This hands-on learning experience not only introduced them to geological phenomena like earthquakes and volcanoes but also deepened their understanding of scientific concepts such as chemical reactions and matter transformation.



➤➤➤ YEAR 6 ORIENTATION AND TRANSITION

Our Year 6 students began their exciting journey into senior school life with a warm and well-structured orientation and transition experience. Divided into small groups, they explored the senior school campus, becoming familiar with the library, science labs, ICT suites, and creative art spaces.

They were introduced to senior school teachers, the pastoral care team, and key support staff who will guide them as they make the leap from Junior to Senior learning. This vital transition ensures that our students feel confident, supported, and excited about the next chapter in their educational journey.



➤➤➤ YEAR 6 FLAME REACTION EXPERIMENT

Our Year 6 students had an exciting day in the chemistry lab, exploring how different metals change the colour of the flame upon contact.

Through this hands-on practical lesson, students discovered the science behind flame tests — observing stunning shades from vibrant greens to bright reds as various metals like copper, lithium, and sodium reacted with the flame.

This experience not only sparked their curiosity about chemical reactions but also introduced them to the real techniques used by scientists to identify elements.



➤➤➤ WORLD SEA TURTLE DAY FESTIVAL

Over the weekend the Wildlife and Environment Club of Oshwal Academy Mombasa members participated in the World Sea Turtle Day Festival at the Kenya Wildlife Service Marine Park, an event organised by KWS and the Wildlife Clubs of Kenya.

- Turtle walk (Conservation awareness walk)
- Presentations about the turtles.
- Exhibition of recycled materials.

Due to the closure of the beach, they did not participate in the creative sand sculptures competition.


