CELEBRATING YEAR 6 GRADUATION 2026



➤➤➤ YEAR 1 TRIP TO LUNAR PARK

Year 1 learners had an exciting trip to Lunar Park. They explored the world of forces through play and discovery.

The children had an amazing time enjoying the swings, slides, and climbing equipment while learning how forces help objects move, helping them understand the effects of pushes and pulls.

They discovered that forces are all around us and play an important role in our everyday lives. The trip was a wonderful blend of learning and fun, allowing the children to connect classroom concepts with real-world experiences.



➤➤➤ YEAR 2 TRIP TO BAMBURI BEACH VILLAS

Our Year 2 learners had a wonderful educational trip to Bamburi Beach Villas, where learning and adventure went hand in hand. They explored shoreline rocks, examining their colours, shapes, sizes, and textures while learning about their formation and importance in nature.

The learners also enjoyed beach walks, sandcastle building, games, and seashell observations, gaining a deeper understanding of the coastal habitat. The trip provided a valuable opportunity to apply classroom learning in a real-world setting while developing teamwork, curiosity, and social skills. A truly memorable day of discovery, learning, and fun!



➤➤➤ YEAR 3 TRIP TO NYALI CINEMAX

As part of their science learning unit, our Year 3 learners visited Nyali Cinemax for an immersive educational experience exploring the concepts of sound and light. Through the movie and related discussions, they deepened their understanding of how sound is produced and transmitted through different materials, as well as the vital role light plays in enabling vision and communicating information.





The learners also investigated the impact of noise pollution on people and the environment, while considering practical ways to reduce noise in their daily lives.

This engaging field trip provided valuable opportunities for experiential learning, allowing students to make meaningful connections between classroom concepts and real-world applications. Learning truly comes alive when curiosity meets experience.



➤➤➤ YEAR 3 SCIENTIFICALLY EXPLORE FRICTION AND FORCE

Our Year 3 learners became young scientists as they explored the effects of friction and force through exciting hands-on investigations. They tested how different surfaces affect movement, discovered how oil reduces friction, and investigated how varying amounts of force influence how far objects travel. Through observation, measurement, and comparison, they developed important scientific enquiry skills while learning about everyday motion.



➤➤➤ YEAR 3 LEARN UNITS OF MEASUREMENT

This week, our Year 3 learners explored the concept of capacity through engaging, hands-on investigations. Using a variety of measuring jugs, they estimated, measured and compared the capacity of different quantities of liquid, developing their practical measurement and enquiry skills.

As part of their learning, learners also practised converting between litres (L) and millilitres (mL), deepening their understanding of the relationship between these units and strengthening their mathematical reasoning. Through these interactive activities, learners applied their knowledge in meaningful contexts and built confidence in using standard units of measurement.



>>> YEAR 3 EXPLORE MAGNETS

Our Year 3 learners investigated the fascinating world of magnetism through hands-on scientific inquiry. They explored the properties of magnets, identified magnetic and non-magnetic materials, and compared different types of magnets to investigate magnetic force. Using observation, prediction, and testing, learners determined which magnet produced the greatest magnetic strength. They then recorded and interpreted their findings by constructing a bar graph to represent and analyze their results, strengthening both their scientific investigation and data-handling skills.



>>> YEAR 4 LEARNERS' EDUCATIONAL TRIP TO WATAMU

Our Year 4 learners enjoyed an enriching educational trip to Watamu, where they extended their learning beyond the classroom through a range of engaging, real-world experiences.

Through visits to Arabuko Sokoke Forest, Gede Ruins, Kipepeo Butterfly Farm, and the Snake Park, learners developed their understanding of ecosystems, biodiversity, conservation, history, and cultural heritage. They applied enquiry skills, made observations, and deepened their knowledge through firsthand exploration. The trip also provided a valuable opportunity for personal growth. As their first overnight residential experience away from home, learners demonstrated independence, responsibility, resilience, and collaboration.



>>> YEAR 4 STUDENTS EXPLORE ELECTRICAL CIRCUITS

Year 4 students explored the exciting topic of electrical circuits. The learners identified the different components of a simple circuit, including a cell (battery), wires, bulb and a switch. The students worked in groups to build their own simple circuits. This hands-on learning experience encouraged curiosity, teamwork, and problem-solving skills. To deepen their understanding, the learners carried out several tests.

Through these experiments, the students made predictions, observed carefully, recorded their findings, and discussed their results. The practical activities made learning enjoyable and helped the learners develop important scientific enquiry skills.

The electrical circuits unit was both fun and engaging, and Year 4 students showed great enthusiasm as they explored how electricity works in everyday life.



>>> YEAR 5 VIRTUAL REALITY

To consolidate their learning on Earth and Space, Year 5 learners embarked on a virtual journey through space.

They explored the planets, observed their differences, and compared their relative sizes. This experience enabled them to gain a deeper understanding of the vastness and wonder of our solar system.



>>> YEAR 6 CHEMISTRY JOURNEY INTO THE FUTURE

Our Year 6 learners don't just learn science; they experience its magic. From mysterious clouds of smoke and flames to explosive reactions and colour changing chemicals, our young scientists stepped into the laboratory and discovered that learning is an adventure. Every experiment sparked wonder, nurtured confidence and transformed curiosity into discovery. Here, science is not confined to textbooks; it comes alive in the hands and minds of our learners, inspiring them to question, explore and dream bigger. Imagine the limitless possibilities that await them in senior school.

>>> YEAR 7-10 INTER-HOUSE SCIENCE CONTEST

Our school transformed into a bustling hub of curiosity, collaboration, and cutting-edge creativity as learners from Year 7 to Year 10 faced off in our highly anticipated Inter-house Science Contest.

This was hands-on, high-energy science at its finest! Working in dynamic house teams, every single student jumped into the fray to collaborate, think critically, and push the boundaries of their scientific knowledge.

Teams kicked off the day by putting their heads together to crack a series of complex scientific riddles. Logic, speed, and lateral thinking were the keys to success as students decoded clues that tested their across-the-board science savvy.

Without a single reference sheet in sight, students relied on memory and teamwork to recreate the Periodic Table. The twist? They had to do it with a creative flair! From 3D models to artistic conceptual layouts, our houses proved that science and art make a powerful formula.

Houses were tasked with not only solving intricate chemical reactions but also presenting their solutions in highly creative, visual ways. Students were tested on their foundational lab skills. Without any assistance, teams had to correctly identify various pieces of laboratory apparatus, sketch them with precision, and clearly outline their vital significance in scientific experimentation.

Teams collaborated to design and draw stunning, creative representations of our solar system. The resulting astronomical artwork showcased a deep understanding of celestial mechanics, scale and planetary beauty.

Every activity was deliberately designed to ensure maximum participation. No single student could win it alone; it required the collective brainpower, communication, and unique strengths of every team member.



>>> YEAR 7 LEARNERS EXPLORE WORLD OF OPTICS

Our Year 7 learners dived into the world of optics by investigating plane mirrors. The challenge? To understand how we see our reflection. Through a series of engaging practical tasks, students traced light rays and discovered the two key laws of reflection and image formation. They learned that while the image appears to be behind the mirror, it is simply a trick of the light—a virtual image that is laterally inverted. The lesson emphasized that physics isn't just in textbooks; it's in the bathroom mirror every morning. A fantastic display of scientific reasoning from our young physicists!



>>> IN PURSUIT OF MATHEMATICAL EXCELLENCE

Our school recently participated in the University of Waterloo's prestigious annual mathematics competition series. Students in Year 9 took on the Pascal Contest; Year 10 students tackled the Galois Contest, and Year 11 students engaged with the Hypatia Contest.

This year, a total of 14 students from these grade levels demonstrated their analytical skills and commitment by taking part in these rigorous assessments.

>>> DHAIRYAN SHAH WINS FOUR COAST REGIONAL TITLES

Dhairyan Shah becomes the first Table Tennis player in OAM history to clinch four top-flight Coast Regional Table Tennis titles. Dhairyan has maintained consistency throughout his career with an unbeaten record on 3 titles.

In this year's KSSSA Coast Regional games held in Kwale between 9th to 11th July 2026, Dhairyan left with unbeaten record clinching gold medal. His teammate Romir Doshi finished 4th overall in the games.

Radhika Katwa, for the first time, clinches a gold medal in the girls' Badminton during the KSSSA games. Naiya Pandya settled for Bronze.

The four players have qualified to represent Coast Region during the KSSSA National games scheduled for 28th July to 1st August 2026 in Kiambu County.



>>> COAST OPEN CHESS TOURNAMENT

Our school attended the Coast Open Chess Tournament, which was held at the Sai Rock Hotel. The tournament was divided into two sections: an Open section that played classical chess (90 minutes + 30 seconds per player) and a Junior section that played rapid chess (25 minutes per player). We had representation in both sections. This is how we fared:

In the open section category, we had three students playing in the U1700.

In a very challenging section with many rated players, this is how they performed: Vihaan Albert Shah scored 3/6 points; Eashan Anish Shah scored 3/6 points and Swaleh Ibrahim Swaleh scored 2/6 points.

In the junior section category, we had two players from the U-7 boys: Hakeem Mwashoni got 4/6 points, coming in 5th place and Shaurya Patel got 2.5/6 points. Loice Waridi got 3/6 points, getting 2nd place in the Under 7 girls.

In the Under 9 boys Leonardo Mattar scored 4.5/6 points, with Jiyaan Shah at 4/6 points, Shaunak Patel at 4/6 points, Ely Mattar with 3.5/6 points and Michael Kioko scoring 3/6 points.

In the Under 9 girls' Zuri Mwashoni scored 3/6 points, getting 2nd place and Iman Mwashoni scored 1/6 points.

In the Under 11 boys Naksh Gosrani got 3/6 points, Maria Bockle scored 2/6 points in the Under 11 girls and Melvin Mbui got 3/6 points in the Under 13 boys. Congratulations to our students for a commendable performance.

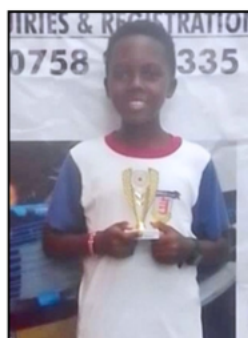
